No-one took issue with this important consideration - noting that failure to do so COULD lead to a significant fine! le. When heading home from paddling on Elkwater, IF the lights are flashing at the 'weigh station' on the highway, you MUST report into the station and have your boat checked for any mussels or other debris that could contaminate other bodies of water. There is a SIGNIFICANT fine for 'skipping' checking in and driving on by! It was also noted that many Members make a concerted effort to pick up garbage and other debris along our waterways when out paddling.
